

Darija is a group of Arabic dialects spoken in North Africa. It differs from Classical Arabic (or Modern Standard Arabic) in its vocabulary, pronunciation, and the influence of languages such as Berber, French, Spanish, and Italian.

Around 70 million people speak Darija in various Maghreb countries.
